The written meliage of Corn-planter dated at Shelad! on The 10. day of February last, was not received by as until some weeks after - Her request that we would take under our care two y Senera Boys, one of Them his own son, accompanied with the son , Joseph Nicholson, we have consider it, and do agree to receiver them when they can be conveniently sent to us, entending they shall be breated with cure and thendness, and instructed in reading, writing und Husbandry as the Children of our Freends are taughting Governor of Termigloania, Strang inform & of their proposal having expressed his approbation theore of as deil General Stros -Segnid on behalf and by appointment of a meeting of the Mepres. of the said people the 2 day of the 6 mo, called Jane 1791 - Fit
